1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?
 There were several steps to creating the pole. On October 19, 2024 we had 7 Rotarians creating the copperplates for the pole. We met two Saturdays with 5 Rotarians working on the mosaic tiles, 5 Rotarians helping to move the pole and 6 Rotarian working on the third side of the pole.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project? 23 Rotarians duplicated (2 unduplicated)

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Creating and etching the copperplates with the word peace in different languages, tiling the mosaic pole, and moving the peace pole to the final location.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? 15 students, five artisans

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

The pole has been permanently placed a Higher Grounds an afternoon school and community program. The peace pole will be a lasting monument to confirm peace within the community. The peace pole has logos for Rotary, Higher Ground and the Friends of Arts to highlight the joint efforts. The Peace Pole will be dedication on Wednesday, June 25, 2025.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? The Friends of the Arts assisted in the design and creation of all the ceramic pieces with peace logos, Rotary and Higher Ground logos. Higher Ground staff will assist with the placement and provide the grounds for setting the peace pole. The students at Higher Ground assisted in tiling the mosaic on the pole.
