Project Description:

1. Describe the project. What was done, when, and where did project activities take place? If this is a progress report, what remains to be done?

The Learn to Lead project was a literacy and leadership initiative implemented in Jamaica, Queens, NY, aimed at empowering children aged 5 to 12 from underprivileged and immigrant communities, particularly those facing challenges in reading, writing, and creative thinking. The program began on September 8, 2024, and ran through April 27, 2025, culminating in an award ceremony. Over the course of the project, seven cohorts participated in structured learning sessions that included reading and writing assignments, essay creation, business plan development, and creative art activities. Notably, an art session held in celebration of International Mother Language Day allowed children to express cultural pride and creativity, with artwork later displayed publicly during a rally organized by Shilpangan on February 16, 2025. To support learning, the project provided educational materials and iPads funded by the Heritage New York Rotary Club. Fundraising efforts exceeded initial goals, allowing the team to purchase and distribute ten iPads instead of six.All planned activities have been completed successfully, and no additional actions remain. The project has officially concluded with the award ceremony held on April 27, 2025, where participating students received their iPads as recognition for their accomplishments.

- 3. Who were the beneficiaries, how were they impacted by this project, and what

The beneficiaries of the Learn to Lead project were children aged 5 to 12 from underprivileged and immigrant families in Jamaica, Queens, NY—many of whom were from Bangladeshi backgrounds and faced challenges in English literacy due to language barriers and limited educational support. These children often lacked access to adequate academic resources and opportunities available in more affluent areas. Through the project, participants received structured support in reading, writing, creative thinking, and leadership development. They engaged in educational activities such as essay writing, business plan creation, and art-based learning, which helped boost their literacy, confidence, and self-expression. Cultural activities, including an art session tied to International Mother Language Day, provided space for the children to connect with their heritage and build pride in their identity. The humanitarian need addressed was educational inequality. The project helped bridge the gap by providing tools and resources—such as iPads and creative materials—that the children would not otherwise have access to. These resources supported their continued learning beyond the classroom and encouraged long-term academic growth. By equipping students with these skills and tools, the project empowered them to envision a more hopeful and successful future.
