Project Description:

1. Briefly describe the project. What was or will be done and where did or will the project activities take place? Explain how the beneficiaries and other community members were or will be involved?

Greeley Redeye Rotary did this project on 12/14/17 with additional funds from a Centennial Grant. Redeye, members embrace projects which include financial support as well as the opportunity for direct/active participation of our members. This project was both in spades! Our local school district has an ongoing partnership with our local Habitat for Humanity. Habitat for Humanity, per their ongoing mission, identifies families in need of housing that are able to meet criteria including a personal contribution of sweat-equity in the building of the home. Our local school district includes Jefferson High School, a non-traditional high school with at-risk students who have multiple socioeconomic challenges, some include multi-generational poverty. Jefferson High School offers a Construction Management Pathway Program to their students where part of the curriculum includes construction management and a hands-on opportunity to learn carpentry skills. A Redeye Rotary contribution to this partnership allows our members to participate in affecting change in the lives of several families in our community. A family gets their own home and the high school students have the opportunity to learn and practice construction management and carpentry skills; which are in high demand here in Colorado. With this unique high school curriculum these construction-skilled high school grads are in demand in our local booming construction market and have the opportunity to earn a good wage for their families. Redeye's financial contribution helped to purchase construction materials. The project plan was that our members would participate on a building site actively working alongside the Jefferson High School students in the construction of a Habitat home. Unfortunately the weather did not cooperate. The plan was to help paint the exterior of the house, but very high winds on our project day made this impossible.

Following our morning work session in the Re-Store, we shared a buffet lunch with the Jefferson HS Students, the refugee Habitat house family, the Re-Store manager and staff, and Greeley Habitat for Humanity Board members prior to the board's monthly meeting.

2. How many Rotarians participated in this project?

Half of our membership (10) participated.

3. What did or will they do? Please give at least two examples.

Because of the high winds we were not able to help paint the exterior of the home as planned. Instead we worked inside the Habitat Re-Store alongside the Jefferson HS construction mgmt. students and the refugee family selected for the Habitat home.

Our project date was early in December (12/ so we worked to switch out some of the Habitat Re-Store retail displays to include Christmas decorations which were also being offered for sale.

Several Redeye Rotarians also worked on setting up a display of faux stone to be sold for use on home exteriors.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? _____

It is difficult to know an accurate number of those who benefited, as there is a significant 'trickle-down' effect from this type of project. Working with Greeley/Evans School District 6 and their alternative High School Construction Management Program, the students in the program benefit (9 students were present on our work day) as well as their families. Additionally, the family who received the Habitat home also benefited. The family was a refugee family from Burma which included a husband, wife, child and sister of the couple.

5. Who are the beneficiaries and what is or will be the expected long-term community impact of this project?

As stated above, all of those referred to (and their families) are the beneficiaries. These are all members of the Greeley community.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was their role?

There were no additional Rotary organizations involved, however the program that our project benefitted is a joint program that includes the local Greeley/Evans school district, and their alternative HS students, together with Habitat for Humanity.


