1. Briefly describe the project. What was done, when and where did project activities take place, and who were the beneficiaries?

Emergency hygiene kits for the homeless. Love Placentia was held on Saturday, April 22 at the Champion Sports Complex in Placentia. 220 hygiene kits were assembled. The items were placed on several long tables and the volunteers selected a large plastic bag and began placing one of each item in the bag. The items were: a pair of white crew socks, chapstick, sunscreen, hand sanitizer, toothbrush, toothpaste, band-aids, a granola bar, bottle of water, packet of tissues, and one-day bus pass. 50 kits included feminine hygiene products as well. The assembled kits were delivered to CityNet, a local agency contracting with many North Orange County cities, to assist with the homeless in their community.

This was one of several projects performed throughout Placentia. Before all of the projects began, there was an assembly of all the participants for an opening ceremony event. The Rotary Club of Placentia was one of the organizations that provided food for breakfast. The club provided sausages for 400 meals.

2. How many Rotarians participated in the project?

10 Club members and 6 family members helped in the project and breakfast preparation

3. What did they do? Please give at least two examples.

Purchased many of the items, assisted with the set-up, filled the kits, and cleaned up. Delivered the kits to CityNet. Prepared sausages for the Love Placentia opening ceremony.

4. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project?

15 non-Rotarian volunteers benefitted from helping the community as part of the Love Placentia event. Well over 100 homeless citizens will benefit from the kits themselves.

5. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project?

Dignity for the homeless, demonstrating care and compassion to our fellow residents.

6. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role?

CityNet distributes hygiene to the homeless in several cities in North Orange County.
