Project Description

1. Briefly describe the project outcomes. What was done (in 100 words or less)?
The Club purchased and delivered basic goods e.g., mattresses, sheets, blankets, towels, flatware, paper products, shampoo, for families that were moving into temporary housing provided by Save the Family, a nonprofit located in Mesa, AZ.
2. When (dates) and where (city, state, and country) did project activities take place?
Purchase activities were primarily online transactions that began in September 2023 and concluded in March 2024. The household goods were sent to the Rotarian purchaser in Fountain Hills, AZ and subsequently delivered to STF headquarters in Mesa, AZ.
3. Who were the beneficiaries?
Direct beneficiaries were former homeless families that receive temporary housing and counseling from STF.
4. How many Rotarians participated in the project? What did they do? Please give at least two examples.
Six Rotarians participated in the project. Once Grant funds were available, the Project Chairman requested a list of family needs from his STF coordinator. That list was subsequently delegated to Rotarian volunteers who purchased the items and delivered them to the Project Manager or directly to STF. This process was repeated several times until the Grant funds were exhausted.
5. How many non-Rotarians benefited from this project? It is estimated that approximately 15 families benefited.
6. What are the expected long-term community impacts of the project? Family homelessness is an ongoing crisis in the Valley of the Sun. Those who are fortunate enough to get help from nonprofit groups like STF have an opportunity to move forward by becoming more self-sufficient.

7. If a cooperating organization was involved, what was its role? [The Rotary Club of Fountain Hills has worked with Save the Family for several years. They are a well-managed organization that assists 80 – 100 homeless families each year by providing temporary shelter, job training and counseling .](#)


