STATUS SUMMARY

CSA San Diego County is a non-profit organization dedicated to serving the needs of our community. Our anti-human trafficking program is focusing on providing forums to raise awareness on the issue of sex trafficking here in San Diego County. Our forums are serving as a prevention measure for the communities of San Diego County on indicators of sex trafficking. These forums include a screening of a documentary on sex trafficking called "Chosen" and it is followed by a panel discussion featuring sex trafficking survivors, law enforcement, and representatives from the San Diego District Attorney's Office. The goal of this program is to reach as many middle schools and high schools in San Diego County to prevent the trafficking of teenage girls and boys by educating students, members of the community on the identification of potential victims, and recognizing signs of the psychological manipulation, drug use, and violence utilized by pimps. So far we have hosted three educational forums on sex trafficking at schools in San Diego County and have plans to host another three educational forums by the end of May. Overall these events are helping raise awareness and incite communities to get involved in supporting the efforts to eradicate human trafficking in San Diego County.
