## San Jacinto, Guatemala Water Projects

Rotary Global Grant # 1410685 for \$35,000 is aimed at supplying potable water to the inhabitants of four small rural communities in the San Jacinto, Guatemala municipality. This is a continuation of three previous grants that were started in 2007 that implemented water distribution systems to several other small rural communities in San Jacinto. These projects could not be completed without the help of the Rotary Club of Chiquimula de la Sierra and the support of the Mayor and staff of San Jacinto. The pictures shown here were taken by Chiquimula Rotarians and are of the first of the four water projects to be completed. The first water system constructed is in the village of Los Lorenzo.

The source of the water is from a spring. The water flow from the spring is enough to supply water to the community of Los Lorenzo and also to the community of Los Gonzales.


